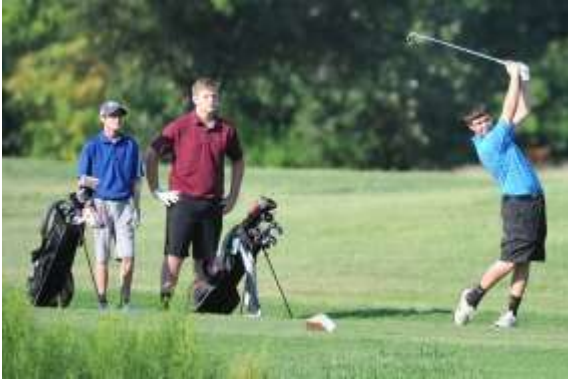


Massey takes second round lead after 66

Arlington Heights student Steven Brandon Massey, 16, zipped to the front of the FWJGA Boys City Junior Golf Championship on Tuesday by carving out a 6-under-par 66 at Ridglea Country Club's Championship (South) Course.

Massey put together 3-under-par 33s on the front and back sides from the White tees that played about 6,464 yards and leads Brendan Powers and Casey Cull by two shots. Powers, 16, of Mansfield was among the three

leaders after the first round with a 69 at Walnut Creek Pecan Course and finished Tuesday with a 2-under 70. Cull, 16, of Mansfield posted the day's second best score of 5-under 67 to tie Powers at 139. Two strokes behind them are Kyle Engelbert, 18, of Fort Worth, Chris Berzina, 17, of Fort Worth and David Harrison, 15, of Trophy Club.

The other two Monday leaders, Dustin Anderson, 16, of Granbury and Garrett Leek, 17 of Brock posted 75s and are at 144.

The Championship and First flights will continue Wednesday at Shady Oaks Country Club.

Massey, a member of Ridglea, carded eight birdies and two bogeys to push ahead of the pack. Cull's 67 was boosted by an eagle three on the 535-yard par-5 fourth hole. He added five birdies to help offset two bogeys.

Power's round included four birdies and two bogeys.

The Second and Third flights also promise to be interesting with several players within the lead. In the Second Flight, Reece Posey notched a 71 at Mansfield National and is tied with James Demarque for the lead. Demarque came in with a 72 and both are at 150. A shot behind is Robby Evans, whose 73 put him at 151 and a shot ahead of three others. They'll play the third round at Mira Vista C.C.

There are at least 12 players in the hunt in the Third Flight. Five are tied for the lead at 160 and seven are at 161. Leading with 160 total are Collin Benavides, 17, of Burleson, Thomas Demers, 18, of Colleyville, Michael Gower, 16, of Keller, Ellis Liversidge, 16, of Fort Worth, and Josh Murray, 18, of Fort Worth. They played at Mansfield National and Demers carded a 77, Liversidge a 78, Benavides an 80, Gower an 80 and Murray an 81. The flight joins the Second Flight Mira Vista Country Club for Wednesday's Round.

Division IV golfers played nine holes Tuesday at Sycamore Creek G.C., and was split into two flights. Clark Lanter, 16, of Mansfield and John Bowman, 14, of Burleson gained the lead in the Seventh Flight with 147 totals. Clark had opened with a 99 Monday at Diamond Oaks and carded a 48 Tuesday for a 147 total. Bowman followed his 106 at Meadowbrook with a 41. A shot behind is Tyler Markwood, 14,

of Keller and William Cantrell, 16, of Arlington. The Eighth Flight also is close with Parker Chapman, 15, of North Richland Hills owning a shot lead after a 51. Heston Nichol, 15, of Fort Worth, who also shot a 41, is at 161 and Brady Holt, 14, of Azle, carded a 48 and is at 161.

After Wednesday's round, the field will be cut for the final round, also at Sycamore.

The 11-13 division played matches at River's Edge, but will move back to Sycamore for Wednesday's round. There are four remaining in each flight and the two winners will play play for first and second place in Thursday's final round.

Logan Bettinger, 10, of Fort Worth maintained his lead in the 8-10, 6-hole division at River's Edge by carding a second-round 22 for a 39 two-day total. However, Soloman Wiertzema, 10, of Saginaw closed the gap to two shots by notching a 21 Tuesday for a 41 total.

In the First Flight, Will Johnson, 8, of Cleburne held his shot lead over Soren Harris, 10, of Trophy Club. Both shot 25s for 49 and 50 totals, respectively. In the Second Flight, Haden Greer, 10, of Fort Worth stretched his one shot lead to nine after his 24 and 52 total. Alex Hall, 9, of Hudson Oaks held his second-place spot after a 32 and 61 total.

They will continue stroke play again Wednesday.
